Re: Friday Memo for April 30th, 2021

Good Afternoon, Mustang Families:

I hope this memo finds everyone well! The last week has been busy, as you are all well aware, due to the cases of COVID-19 in the school and moving the grades 7 to 9 classes, as well as a grade 3 class to online learning. First and foremost, I would like to apologize for not putting out a Friday Memo last week, however Mrs. Brownlee and I were contact tracing and preparing teachers and students for online learning. In total we had about 150 students and 5 staff move to isolation. Officially, Muir Lake has moved to "outbreak status" and this is reflected in the provincial online map and other websites such as <u>SOS</u> that report COVID-19 cases in the province and in schools.

An outbreak is reported when 5 or more cases are confirmed in an investigation, where the disease could have been acquired or transmitted in the school. Contact tracers and public health officials have identified potential exposures and classes have been sent home for online learning in order to limit spread within the school.

An outbreak investigation is considered over when there have been no new confirmed cases in the school for 28 days. Clearly, now more than ever, vigilance is needed in order to protect our community.

In non-pandemic related news, we determined teaching assignments for next year. There have been some changes in work assignments. In order to provide opportunities for teachers to build their personal and professional capacities and expertise, Muir Lake will have the following assignment changes in the upcoming school year:

These, in turn will support student success by enhancing our school with teachers expanding their professional repertoires.

Finally, one other significant change next year is that Musical Theater will be offered outside the timetable. In the past, students who took musical theatre did it during options class and it was limited to two terms. This created quite a bit of stress for students as they were limited in rehearsal time and the turn around from start to finish was a bit rushed. Further, this option ran two out of three terms and students were limited in the number of options they could take as opposed to other students.

So, as a solution to this problem, we will be offering Musical Theatre after school. The schedule will be determined by the teacher in consultation with the students. Naturally, in my mind's eye, in the Fall, rehearsals/practices will be less and as time approaches the date of the spring production, more frequent meetings/classes will take place.

This change in scheduling adds to student choice and for students to pursue more interests in their option programming. Mrs. Gottenbos will be deciding what next year's production will be shortly and we will be announcing that before the year ends. Naturally, this is presuming that we will be returning to normal next year.

1. Classroom Teacher Requests for 2021/22: ***Repeated Information***

This year, when we were creating classes, we opened up classroom requests because of the pandemic. The school wanted to ensure, as much as possible, that friends could be with friends, etc because of the limitations of cohorts in school and social restrictions within the community. We knew that children would have severe limitations and tried to ease that burden by allowing parental requests for specific teachers and/or classrooms. This created imbalances in classrooms that were unforeseen and not ideal.

For this year, we are operating under the premise that cohorting will not be required due to vaccinations available to people. Therefore, we hope for greater freedom in school, at recess, with sports, etc. With that said, we are **not** taking parental requests for specific teachers or classes this year. Last year, from August 12th until the start of school, Mrs. Garley and I worked on re-arranging class configurations and the amount of time devoted to that was staggering.

There are a lot of considerations when Administration makes classes: gender, learning needs, social needs, population size, etc. have an enormous impact on class composition. Also, teacher assignments most likely will be changing next year once the budget is determined. For these reasons, we cannot honour requests for specific teachers at this time.

2. School Council: ***Updated Information***

ASCA is a provincial advocacy group that lobbies the government on matters such as funding, transportation, etc. and is comprised of members of all school councils across the province. Mrs. Flynn volunteered her time to attend and help address issues that all parents in Parkland School Division parents are facing such as Inclusive Education, transportation and provincial funding shortfalls.

Mrs. Flynn will summarize the ASCA AGM and specifically talk about some of the resolutions that were passed or tabled at the weekend meeting. 4. PAT (Provincial Achievement Tests): ***Repeated Information***

Parkland School Division with the permission of the Government of Alberta, has made the decision not to administer the Provincial Achievement Tests in grades six and nine this year. 8. Revised Bell Schedule for 2021/2022: ***Repeated Information***

Muir Lake School, along with other schools within Parkland School Division, was required to adjust our Bell Schedule slightly due to the fact that there was a slight decrease in operational days from 184 days to 182 days. This reduction was necessary in order to make next year's calendar work for holidays, statutory holidays, etc. (Most notably, Christmas Break). To compensate for this slight reduction, schools have reconfigured bell times in order to add time back to the school schedules so that there is no change in instructional time.
