Good Afternoon, Mustang Families and Friends:

As you may or may not be aware, we have had 2 confirmed positive COVID 19 cases in the school over the past few days. This means that Alberta Health Services declares Muir Lake School as officially in "outbreak status".

So, what does this mean for us as a school community? It means that now, more than ever, we must be vigilant in trying to contain the spread of this virus in our community for the safety of everyone. The new provincial restrictions only serve to highlight and reinforce this point.

I particularly like the advice from Dr. Hinshaw when she gave her press conference on December 8th, 2020. She said,

"This is about reducing the spread, not finding loopholes. Stick to your household. If you are unsure about what to, please err on the side of caution and make the safest choice. Remember: the goal is to bend the curve, not the rules. So please be careful, let's be kind to each other and embrace the collective responsibility that we all share."

I would like to personally thank all those families who chose to self-isolate during this school outbreak, even when it was unclear whether or not they should isolate because contract tracing determined they fell into a "grey" area and did not have to.

As families, you have demonstrated an abundance of caution, a caring and a community minded approach to safe-guarding our Muir Lake community. Your sacrifices are both noted and appreciated by your school (staff included) and your community. This is what I have come to know as the Muir Lake community and what makes me proud to serve Muir Lake families.

As we head into our holiday season, let us remember our blessings and let us be kind to one another. Stay safe and have a great weekend.

<u>1. News from the Westview Public Health:</u> ***New Information***

Grade 7 students were to be vaccinated on December 9, 2020. However, due to moving to online learning, this obviously did not happen. Westview Health Clinic will contact you once new arrangements are made for vaccines for grade 7 students.

Our Grade 6 vaccinations on December 9th, 2020 were cancelled due to our outbreak status as a school. These vaccinations will be rescheduled at a later, undetermined date.

Students in Grade 9 have received consent packages for vaccinations, if you have not yet returned your consent forms, then either send them to school with a sibling or send them directly to Westview Public Health Unit by today, December 11, 2020 in order for your child to receive their vaccination.

Vaccinations for Grade 9 students are scheduled for **January 19, 2021**, provided that we, as a province, return to in-school learning

6. Contract Tracing for COVID positive cases: ***Repeated Information***

Contract tracing for positive COVID cases in schools has been typically handled by Alberta Health Services. Due to the surge in cases and personnel shortages in AHS, Parkland School Division will be handling contract tracing if there is a positive COVID case to be found in a school. Division Office and the school will be in contact with families of students if they are considered a close contact of a positive case. 9. Option 2 Learners (virtual): ***New Information***

For students in Option 2 (virtual) learning, there will be changes to your program as Parkland School Division is reconfiguring resources and teachers to provide better programming for the Division's virtual learning students.

First, as we announced this week, Mrs. Lindsay Imeson will be leaving Muir Lake staff to start new adventures in British Columbia with her family. We wish her all the best in her upcoming move and would like to mention that she will be missed in our virtual classrooms. Mrs. Imeson has been the face and voice of our on-line program.





With Mrs. Imeson leaving, this gave Muir Lake School and the Division the opportunity to look at resource allocation and how we could better program for all virtual students in Parkland School Division. There was a lot of thought and planning as to how virtual learning could be reconfigured. Both Parkland School Division and Muir Lake school are pleased to announce a re-configured virtual environment starting January 04th, 2021.

What this means is students will be grouped in more heterogeneous groups (single grades or combined groups such as 5/6, for example) as opposed to groupings spanning multiple grades. So, as a Muir Lake student, this means you will have a change of teacher and the teacher may be located at a different school.

It should be noted that this reconfiguration only affects students in K to 4 at Muir Lake. Students in grades 5 to 9 will remain with their current virtual teachers.

10. Virtual Learning - All Students K to 9 - Jan 04th to 11th, 2021: ***New Information***

As you are aware, the Government of Alberta mandated that all students in the province attend on-line school for the week of <u>January 4th, 2021 to January 8th, 2021</u> with a scheduled return to in-class learning on <u>January 11, 2021.</u>

For our students and parents, we will be sending home a virtual learning package next week that outlines the expectations of learning in the virtual environment. Additionally, there will be schedules for each class that clearly outline the times for Google Meets and/or tutorials for your children. Naturally, when you receive the document and if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us at the school next week.

11. Enhanced Measures Due to Outbreak Status for Muir Lake School: ***New Information***

With the targeted health measures in place for the entire province, and with the recent declaration of an outbreak at our school, we know you are more concerned about keeping yourself and your child(ren) safe.

To help limit the potential spread of COVID-19 in our school and in our community, Muir Lake School is implementing enhanced measures when it comes to mask wearing while in school. Effective immediately, ALL staff and Grade 4 - 9 students will be asked to wear a mask whenever they cannot maintain minimal physical distancing from others in the school. This will include during class time unless students and staff can maintain a 2 m distance.

This school protocol will be reassessed after the province reassesses their latest targeted health measures.

Although the use of masks is only one of the preventative measures we can take to help curb the spread of COVID-19, we are confident these enhanced protocols will help to keep our students and staff safe, while maintaining our classroom cohorts.

There will be circumstances at school in which masks will not be required (e.g. outdoor activities or activities in which students and staff maintain appropriate physical distancing) and we will be sure to





respect those needs. Other masking requirements, as part of the Alberta Education school re-entry plan, outside of classrooms remain unchanged.

Students and staff must continue to use the <u>Alberta Health Daily checklist</u> each day prior to coming to school and to stay home if they are sick. While at school, we continue to encourage frequent hand washing and the use of hand sanitizer whenever possible.
