Good Afternoon, Mustang Families and Friends:



Naturally, as we head into Fall break, we are reminded of this sombre time of year when we need to reflect upon our freedoms and liberties that we enjoy: freedom of speech, freedom of assembly, and the protection of rights of all people in our society.

My grandfather was born prior to World War I, and was a young family man (farmer) with 3 children during World War II and lived to see many other world conflicts. Our family was located in the Medicine Hat/Cypress Hills area and because he was a farmer, he was not conscripted. However he did his part for the war effort.

My grandfather and grandmother billeted German prisoner soldiers and they worked on the family farm. My grandfather talked of sacrifices that he and his family made, particularly with regard to luxury items, food items, and other things that we, today, take for granted. The sacrifices made by our Canadian veterans and by previous generations guaranteed our freedoms today.

Our current situation during this pandemic naturally makes us think of some of things that we have lost or that have been put on hold. It is easy for me to feel overwhelmed and mournful of what was less than a year ago. I believe that this is natural. However, I am reminded that for me personally, the sacrifices that I am making now pale in comparison to my forefathers.

However, the exercise of Remembrance Day, the solemnity of marking this day, and reflection on the sacrifices our veterans and their families made reminds me to put my struggles into perspective. I have so much to be thankful for, and this is due to the selfless sacrifice of countless people both from a bygone era and present day. Simply put, I am grateful for all veterans' contributions to peace and order.

# 1. Staying At Home When Sick and COVID Testing: \*\*\*UPDATED Information\*\*\*

- 1. As you may be aware, Dr. Hinshaw changed the requirements for mandatory isolation and/or COVID testing for children in school when they present symptoms. The school division has updated our policies to reflect the changes that the Chief Medical Officer has made.
- 2. Please click on <u>THIS LINK</u> to read the updated policy for staying at home/get a COVID test when symptomatic
- 3. In a nutshell, here is how the symptoms list has changed: Runny nose and sore throat have moved from <u>Symptoms A list to Symptoms B list</u>. It is recommended that if a student displays TWO or more symptoms from the B list, they get COVID tested.
- 4. Symptom A list students need to self isolate for 10 days or have a negative COVID before returning to school.

# 10. Grade 8 Classroom Change: Repeated Information

Our junior high school teachers have requested that both grade 8 classes be moved to the library, so that classroom instruction can happen at one time without splitting time between two rooms.

Currently, grade 8 is our largest class in the school and there is a full time teacher and educational assistant devoted to this grade. Currently, instruction happens in two rooms, with either a teacher or an EA always in one room or another.





Please note: these students are defined as one cohort as they have physical education and lunch hour recess together. By moving to the library, the teachers will be able to devote more attention to the entire group, plus have the support of the EA in the room.

Library services will not be impacted, as Mrs. Schram implemented mobile library carts at the end of September. Books are taken to individual classrooms on carts and Mrs. Shram signs the books out in the classrooms.

# **12.** Summary of Remembrance Day observation at Muir Lake School: \*\*\*New Information\*\*\*

Staff at Muir Lake School were saddened this year that we could not hold our annual Remembrance Day assembly at the school. This is typically a time when students listen to veteran speakers, share stories of their personal families who are veterans and who have served, and naturally observe a moment of silence.

We have modified our commemorations to suit smaller group sizes (classrooms) and here are some of the activities that individual classrooms did in order to mark Remembrance Day:

# 13. Grade 9 Mandatory Isolation and contact tracing: \*\*\*New Information\*\*\*

As you are aware, due to a confirmed case of COVID in our school, a cohort and staff had to go into mandatory quarantine.

Students and staff must quarantine until November 11, 2020, even if a negative COVID test has been obtained.





<u>Here</u> is a link to the guidelines for when there is a Covid contact within a school.

I want to highlight a section on page 3;

"Students identified as close contacts of a confirmed positive case must isolate for 14 days from the date of exposure. They cannot go to school or attend any public place. Even if they test negative for COVID-19, they must stay in isolation for 14 days.
