Re: Friday Memo for January 22nd, 2021

Good Afternoon, Muir Lake Families:

As the weather turns cold, and as driving conditions are again turning for the worse, I need to remind you about safety in our parking lot, particularly during the morning drop off.

I often talk about what our Muir Lake School and Community values are: patience, grace, and understanding, just to name a few. I believe that these values are the cornerstone of a civilized community and it helps ensure that when we come together as a community, rules are followed in order to ensure safety for everyone.

This brings me to our daily drop offs and pick-ups. I need to emphasize that these rules were not put in place to inconvenience anyone. Your child's safety is paramount to ALL staff at Muir Lake School. Therefore, I ask kindly, please do not give staff a difficult time if we are asking you to follow our drop procedures. As mentioned earlier, we do not put these processes in place to make your life difficult.

To clarify, let me outline some procedures that need to be followed:

- 1. Please enter the parking lot at the Community Hall (the north entrance). The south exit is a one-way (as indicated by the DO NOT ENTER sign on the highway) and is for exiting the school property.
- 2. When turning into the school and hall parking lot, please do not drive around a bus that is pulling in. Buses need a wide swath in order to turn in. If they are pulling in, and someone drives past them and does not wait, the bus cannot continue and is ostensibly cut off.
- 3. Please DO NOT back out of the north entrance onto HIGHWAY 779. The dangers of this are self-explanatory, however we have had people do this.
- 4. If you are dropping your children off in the Community Hall parking lot, we encourage students to enter the school yard by the Hall and walk on the INSIDE of the blue railing fence in between the school and the hall. This allows for the movement of traffic to the north entrance and minimizes safety concerns for students.
- 5. Please do not drive in the bus lane whether or not there are buses in that lane. Students are using the crosswalk at the south end of the school and when vehicles are using both lanes, there is a greater chance of an accident in the crosswalk.
- 6. Also, I would like to add that non-bused students are the last students to be released at the end of the day in order to avoid south-bound traffic impeding buses trying to turn left (heading north) at the parking lot.

Finally, please know that we are doing this for the safety of everyone. Your cooperation, support and your kindness is greatly appreciated by all the people working with your children.

1. Registration for the 2021/2022 School Year: ***New Information***

School registration for the next academic school year will start approximately at the beginning to mid February. It is imperative that parents register their children in order to guarantee that a dedicated spot on the bus is guaranteed for September 2021. Late registration does not guarantee a spot on the bus and may take up to 3 weeks to process. Please avoid any uncertainty and frustration by registering your children on time.

As mentioned, registration will happen in the first or second week of February and you will receive an email from Parkland School Division with the appropriate links in order to register your child on-line. You must also have a <u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u> account in order to process the registration. If you have any difficulty registering or need assistance with your <u>Parent Portal account</u>, please contact the front office and we will happily assist you with the registration process.

4. Contract Tracing for COVID positive cases: ***Repeated Information***

Contract tracing for positive COVID cases in schools has been typically handled by Alberta Health Services. Due to the surge in cases and personnel shortages in AHS, Parkland School Division will be handling contract tracing if there is a positive COVID case to be found in a school. Division Office and the school will be in contact with families of students if they are considered a close contact of a positive case. 6. Dropping off Items at the School: ***Repeated Information***

I would like to remind families that we CANNOT accept dropped off items at the door. We have a sharp increase of parents calling to try and drop off various items. While there always is "just this once" argument being made, you must understand that we have many "just this once" arguments being made on a daily basis. We are doing this as per Alberta Education covid19 response guidelines, and we are not doing this as a means of inconveniencing people. Please understand that.

If your child has forgotten their lunch, the front office will provide a lunch to that student. We will not let a child go hungry. They will be provided a basic lunch in these instances.

7. Option 2 Learners (virtual): ***Repeated Information***

For students or parents that are wishing to change from in-person learning to virtual learning, I would like to remind you that the next in-take is Feb 11, 2021 with virtual learning starting on Feb 16, 2021. We cannot accommodate students moving from one program to another outside of these dates. It takes planning and preparation for students to move, and these dates are in place in order to make transitions from program to another as smooth as possible.

Also, please note that Option 2 learning does not look the way it did during the first week of school back from Christmas break. During that week, all teachers were teaching online and there was more time for additional Google Meets, one-on-one time, and small group meets. Unfortunately, that cannot be the case now as most virtual learning teachers have both in-class instruction and virtual learning at the same time.
