About a decade ago, I had the good fortune to spend some time with Dr. Jane Goodall. She was an honorary patron of the school where I was working in Calgary. When one meets Dr. Goodall, you are mesmerized by soft voice, her incredible calmness and her ability to grab and hold our attention. She truly is a remarkable person.

<u>1. Staying At Home When Sick and COVID Testing:</u> ***Repeated Information***

- 1. As you may be aware, Dr. Hinshaw changed the requirements for mandatory isolation and/or COVID testing for children in school when they present symptoms. The school division has updated our policies to reflect the changes that the Chief Medical Officer has made.
- 2. Please click on <u>THIS LINK</u> to read the updated policy for staying at home/get a COVID test when symptomatic

- 3. In a nutshell, here is how the symptoms list has changed: Runny nose and sore throat have moved from <u>Symptoms A list to Symptoms B list</u>. It is recommended that if a student displays TWO or more symptoms from the B list, they get COVID tested.
- 4. Symptom A list students need to self isolate for 10 days or have a negative COVID before returning to school.

2. News from the Westview Public Health: ***Repeated Information***

Grade 6 & 7 students will be vaccinated on December 9, 2020. Consent packages were sent home for grade 6 students a while back and we need to have the signed consent forms back to the front office a.s.a.p.

AHS will try to catch up to any students in other grades who missed immunizations somewhere along the way. Parents will have to phone AHS and make an appointment at a local clinic in order to get the vaccination.

Please note immunization consents provided last year remain valid until immunizations are completed.
