Students that are sick at school will be sent home and may return to school when their symptoms have subsided.

#### Here is the latest from Parkland School Division:

As previously announced on our <u>PSD website</u>, Parkland School Division is taking additional steps to protect students and staff in this global pandemic in the form of a vaccine protocol for adults connected to the school system. This includes visitors, volunteers and parents visiting the school or school division building. This protocol comes into effect Monday, November 15th.

As defined in the Parkland School Division <u>Vaccination Protocol</u>, a visitor means: any individual who does not regularly work or attend the school or site they are visiting, and the individual:

- A. will be entering the school beyond the reception/front entrance for fifteen (15) minutes or longer,
- B. cannot maintain physical distancing, or
- C. will be interacting with students.

Regular volunteers will be able to disclose their vaccination status once with an accompanying signed <u>attestation</u>.

For short term or occasional volunteer activities or for visitors who are entering the school to interact with students or be in situations where physical distancing cannot be maintained, proof of vaccination shall be verified as follows:

- A. Using the QR code and Government of Alberta App (see Appendix A);
- B. Showing a paper/electronic record of vaccination (See Appendix B for acceptable documentation requirements);
- C. Showing a proof of Negative COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Test completed within the last 72 hours;
- D. No permanent record is required to be kept.

Any person coming to a school or Division Building, who is only there to conduct a brief interaction/transaction that will take less than 15 minutes while appropriate health measures are observed (e.g. masking, physical distancing), **will NOT** require proof of vaccination.

This protocol will NOT apply to students.

**Repeat! Westview Health Nurses & Immunizations:** Many parents have had questions regarding school immunizations this year. Here are the highlights for this year.

- Current Grade 6 students should have had an information and consent package sent home for Hepatitis B
  and Human Papilloma Virus vaccines. These are scheduled with the school in October or November.
   Second doses will be scheduled 6 months later.
- Current Grade 9 students will be receiving consent/information packages home in later November or December for dTap (Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis) and Meningococcal Vaccines. These are to be scheduled at the school in the New Year.
- Current Grade 7 and 8 students who did not complete Grade 6 vaccines will be updated at the school between January and April 2022. If your child had a signed consent in Grade 6 it is valid for this second dose.
- Please note that there is no longer a spacing recommendation between the above vaccines, influenza vaccine and COVID 19 vaccines.

#### **COVID-19 Vaccine Frequently Asked Questions | Alberta Health Services**

**Repeat! Winter is Here:** It is looking & feeling like Winter is finally upon us and probably here for the duration. With the snow comes the colder weather, especially in the morning! Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately. Updates on the buses and whether or not they are running can be found on the PSD Website at <a href="https://www.psd.ca/transportation/bus-status">https://www.psd.ca/transportation/bus-status</a>, we encourage you to check there if you have any questions.

**Repeat!** Winter Gear: With winter being here, you wouldn't believe how many pairs of snow pants and boots we have in this building, LOL. Please mark your child's snow pants and boots with their names so that we can ensure that the proper owner has them.

**Repeat! PowerSchool Gradebook Access:** Our staff are working on report cards right now so parents will not be able to access the student's gradebooks on PowerSchool. Report cards will be released on December 17th and we thank you for your patience. online, so we thank you for your patience at this time.

Repeat! No Stopping Signs: For everyone's safety, "No Stopping Signs" have been installed on the highway out front of the school. The speed limit in front of the school is 100 km/hr, this area is NOT a designated school zone and the speed limit does not drop. So, we are asking everyone to comply with the signs that have been posted and NOT stop and park on the highway when dropping off and/or picking up their students from school; please use the Muir Lake Hall parking lot or the drop off lane in the morning.

Repeat! Student Drop Off and Pick Up: For the safety of our students and staff;

- we ask that you park in the Muir Lake Community Hall parking lot and for your child in the parent muster area which is located in the blue fence in between the Community Hall and the school.
- If driving your child(ren) to school, please drive through the drop off lane and drop them off at the crosswalk at the **south** end of the school **OR** drop them off at the Community Hall and have them walk inside the blue fence to and from the school
- please do not cut through the staff parking lot to jump the line of cars waiting to drop off children in the drop off lane
- If you are late and dropping your child(ren) off (after 8:00am), please have them come in the main doors and report in to the office and get a late slip.

Repeat! Dropping Off Items for Your Child (including lunches & water bottles): If your child forgets their lunch or water bottle at home please be assured that we have food and bottled water here for them in this situation. Please do not drop off items for them as we are limiting visitors into the school. We appreciate your cooperation and understanding with this matter.

# VACCINE PROTOCOL IN EFFECT

Please have your vaccine record and ID ready.

- All visitors, volunteers and parents must show either official proof of vaccination (digital/paper copies accepted) or a negative test result (from the last 72 hours) or a medical exemption letter, along with government-issued ID.
- · Students are not required to show proof.
- Any person coming to a school or Division Building, who is only there to conduct a brief interaction/transaction that will take less than 15 minutes while appropriate health measures are observed (e.g. masking, physical distancing), will NOT require proof of vaccination.

# STAY AT HOME GUIDE

THE BOTTOM LINE The amount of time a student needs to stay home from school depends on the type of symptom(s).



#### WHICH SYMPTOM DOES YOUR CHILD HAVE?



# Does your child have ANY of these new or worsening symptoms?

- Fever
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Loss of sense of smell or taste

## Yes, that's my child. Now what?

- Your child must isolate at home for a minimum of 10 days from when symptoms started OR receive a negative COVID-19 test and feel better before returning to activities.
- If your child's test results are positive for COVID-19, isolate at home for at least 10 days and follow instructions received from Alberta Health Services (AHS).



# Does your child have ANY of these new or worsening symptoms?

- Chills
- Sore throat/painful swallowing
- Runny nose/congestion
- Feeling unwell/fatigued
- · Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea
- Unexplained loss of appetite
- Muscle or joint aches
- Headache
- Pink eye (conjunctivitis)

## Yes, that's my child. Now what?

- Keep your child home from school and monitor him/her for 24 hours. If after 24 hours symptoms improve, your child may return to school, if feeling better.
  - A COVID-19 test is not required.
- If your child has any two of the above symptoms or after 24 hours his/her condition gets worse or a second symptom develops:
  - Use the AHS Online Assessment Tool to see if testing is recommended.
  - Your child may return to school after symptoms are gone, even without a COVID-19 test or results.
  - If test results are positive, isolate at home for at least 10 days and follow instructions received from AHS.
