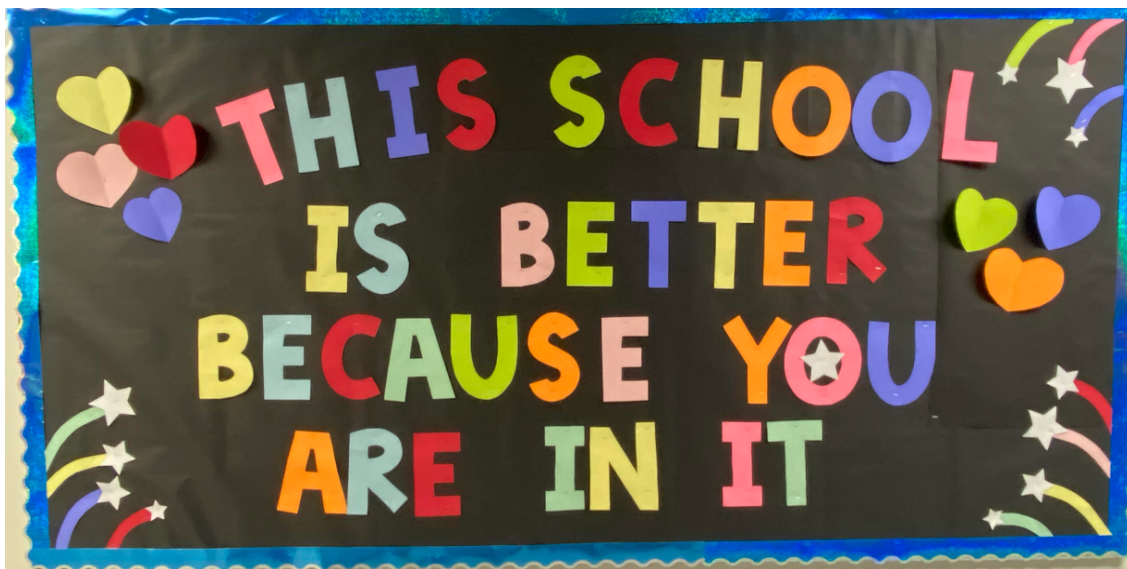

School Profile

There are 501 students from kindergarten to grade 9 with an additional 24 students that attend the Nature Kindergarten program. At Muir Lake School, “every child learns, every child succeeds” is the cornerstone of our philosophy of education. As part of Parkland School Division, we assure supportive learning environments, meaningful experiences and healthy relationships that create opportunities to develop resilience, to gain diversity in perspectives and to achieve enduring success.

School Context

The social economic profile would be best described as diverse. Many of our families are bussed or driven to the school would be considered to be upper middle-income families generally intact. Currently, there are twelve buses that provide transportation for many of the students.

The students' general ability reflects the diverse family backgrounds we serve. To assist students in meeting their needs, we provide small group literacy and numeracy assistance, and counseling services. Students who require extra intervention are on Individual Educational Plans.

Core French is offered to most Grade 4-9 students. A focus of the school has been the integration of technology. Each student has access to either a chromebook or iPad. Many students bring their own devices. Every room also has a sound system and adjustable light system so that students are able to hear and see the teachers' instructions better. A strong focus on student centered learning has resulted in many hands-on learning activities in the core subjects.
