2023 2024 School Year Registration: Parkland School Division's annual online registration/verification process opened on Monday February 13th. We respectfully request that if you have not already done so, that ALL parents have this process completed BEFORE March 24th in order to insure that your child(ren) has transportation in place for the 2023 2024 school year.

All Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 12 registrations for both new and returning students will be conducted online for the 2023-2024 school year.

For existing PSD students, parents can find the RSVP link (Registration) in their <u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u>. For more information, please visit our Division website at https://www.psd.ca/schools/registration.

Any New-to-PSD students (eg. kindergarten) are directed to complete the "NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION" which can be found on the PSD website at https://www.psd.ca/schools/registration. Kindergarten students will need to be 5 years of age by December 31, 2023 (born in 2018).

Families that physically live in the Muir Lake School boundaries with students that are entering grade 10 are reminded that they're directed to attend Memorial Composite High School in Stony Plain. If you have a child that is currently in grade 9 and he/she will **not** be attending MCHS in the fall, then we ask that you please contact us ASAP with where they will be attending for grade 10 so that we can process their transition to high school accordingly. Students that are looking at attending a school other than their designated school need to ensure that they have permission from the desired school to register there.

Parents are reminded that our grade 9 students will be going online in the coming weeks and selecting their grade 10 courses and students will not be allowed to select their courses for MCHS unless their online registration is done. Parents will need to complete the Parkland School Division 2023-2024 Online Registration



for their son/daughter before the student can make their course selection. Parents can find the RSVP link (Returning Student Verification Process) in their PowerSchool Parent Portal.

At this time of the year we are already planning for next year's staffing and class configurations. If your family is planning to not attend Muir Lake School in the 2023 2024 school year, then we respectfully request that you advise us as soon as possible as this will affect our planning process.

Yearbooks will be produced over the summer and be distributed in the Fall when they arrive. The cost of the yearbook will be \$25 each and will be available to all K to 9 students. We thank you for your patience and understanding. Report Cards will be released online on Friday March 17th. Parent/Teacher Interviews are set for March 22 & 23.

Optional Opportunity: Smudging is a part of the First Nation culture and is a respected traditional teaching. It is a natural way to cleanse the body, mind and spirit and rid ourselves of negative energy or thoughts. It is a way to help us to be mindful of the present moment and to honor our personal experiences. The natural plant that will be used to smudge will be sage, a natural herb gathered on the prairies which is often used by our First Nation people in ceremony.

Our school division has a smudging protocol which allows us to smudge in our schools. We are honored to have Parkland School Division support these traditional teachings as we know that this is one step forward towards our collective work with Truth and Reconciliation. (Administrative Procedure 268)

Prior to the winter break, our school had the opportunity to learn about protocol for smudge from a local Elder. The students involved received teachings on how to lead a smudge under the supervision of a teacher. This now enables our school to offer all students the chance to join in a smudge on a weekly basis if they chose to. Participating in the smudge is **optional** and students will be given the opportunity to simply observe and pass when the smudge is presented.

Smudge will be available on Monday mornings as soon as the first bell goes and will finish in time for first class. This means that students will not miss any classroom learning if they participate. More details will be shared with students when they are finalized.

If you would like your child(ren) to participate in similar teachings and/or the regular smudge please provide consent by signing the letter linked below and returning it in its entirety to the class teacher.

Food for Thought: We all know that children learn better on a full tummy. We have a fridge in our office - "The Nutrition Nook" - that is stocked with healthy snacks and food for the students. Kids can access it at any time during the day and out of consideration to everyone's privacy, staff will not be monitoring who uses it.

Lunch Program: If your child will not be at school and you have ordered a hot lunch, please email info@bitetoeat.ca to cancel their lunch. Please be sure to include your child's name and which school they attend. To receive a credit for the meal, you must notify us by 12:00 noon the day before delivery. We will accept late hot lunch cancellations, but no credit will be given. Please note that we cannot give away lunches to other students if you do not notify us that your child will be absent. If you have any questions with regard to any part of the lunch program, please contact the lunch program volunteers at muirlakelunches@gmail.com. The next lunch order deadline is April 25th, so please be sure to get your order in and paid ONLINE before this date.

School Council: All parents and guardians are invited to attend our next **VIRTUAL** School Council meeting on Tuesday, March 21st at 7 pm. Please click the <u>LINK HERE</u> to add your name to receive the School Council Google Meet Link. Meetings will be held on the third teaching Tuesday of the month except for December and June. We hope to see you there.

Dropping off or Picking Up your child at School? If you are driving your child to school, then we respectfully ask that you drop them off in either the **Muir Lake Hall** parking lot **or** use the drop off lane and let them out at the **SOUTH** end or **NORTH** end of the parking lot so that they can use the designated crosswalks which is monitored by the staff. Please assist us in keeping your children safe **by not** dropping them off in the **middle of the drop off lane.**

We also ask that for the safety of all staff and students, that you not drive through the staff parking lot, please use the drive-through lane and the crosswalk at the south end of the parking lot.

For the safety of everyone, we remind everyone that there is to be absolutely **NO PARKING on the side of the highway.** The parking can sometimes get VERY busy, so we appreciate your patience as our top priority is to keep all of our students and staff safe. We have asked the Bylaw officers for assistance with this and we would hate to see anyone be ticketed for parking on the highway or worse yet, for someone to be injured. We thank you for your cooperation with this very extremely important safety matter.

Busing: If you are picking up your child from school and they will NOT be taking their regular bus home, please notify the driver, teacher, or school office so that the driver is not looking for them at the end of the day and delaying the departures of the buses.

Guest Bus Riders: There are to be absolutely **NO GUEST RIDERS** on any of the school buses. This is a huge safety concern should that bus ever be involved in an accident. If your child is having a friend visit after school then a parent will have to pick them up at the end of the day. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Attendance Calls: If your child(ren) is not in attendance, please be sure to either call (780) 963-3535 and press 1 to access the attendance mailbox OR email the office at MuirLake@psd.ca, stating when and why your child will

be away. If the office does not know why students are away then the fan-out message will automatically go out as they will be marked as absent with an unknown reason.

If Your Child is Ill: We encourage anyone who is feeling ill to stay home from school. If you are exhibiting any of the key symptoms known for COVID-19, we encourage you to access one of the many test kits that are also available at the school. Meanwhile, PSD will continue the following:

- Hand sanitizer will still be readily available at all schools,
- Students will continue to be reminded of the importance of thorough hand-washing hygiene,
- School staff will ensure that appropriate cleaning of high touch areas will continue,
- The frequency at which air filters are changed in PSD has also been increased and air handling/ventilation equipment in all schools has been adjusted to maximize the number of air exchanges within the schools.
- All schools will operate filtration systems that meet or exceed the Minimum Efficiency Reporting Values (MERV) 13 air filtration rate, and
- Where practical, entrances and exits can be used to efficiently reduce crowding during high traffic times of the day.
