General Information

Parking at School Safely: If you are driving your child to school, then we respectfully ask that you drop them off in either the **Muir Lake Hall** parking lot **or** use the drop off lane and let them out at the **NORTH** and **SOUTH** end of the parking lot so that they can use the crosswalk which is monitored by the staff. For the safety of everyone, we remind everyone that there is to be absolutely **NO PARKING on the side of the highway**. The parking can sometimes get VERY busy, so we appreciate your patience as our top priority is to keep all of our students and staff safe.

Visitors to the school are also reminded to respect the blue disabled parking spots that are in both the school and the MLCL Hall parking lots.

Visiting the School: Last year we had new security doors installed in the front entrance. This allows us to leave our front door unlocked. If you are at the school for any reason, please check in at the office.

Morning Supervision: Staff will begin supervision at 7:45am so we respectfully request that you do not drop your children off until after this time. Students will remain outside until the bell rings at 8:00am, then at this time they will make their way to the classroom through their designated doors. If they arrive ANY time after 8:10am they are required to go to the office through the front door to obtain a late slip.

Attendance Calls: If your child(ren) is not in attendance, please be sure to either call (780) 963-3535 and press 1 to access the attendance mailbox OR email the office at MuirLake@psd.ca, stating when and why your child will be away. If the office does not know why students are away then the fan-out message will automatically go out as they will be marked as absent with an unknown reason.

School Fees: Statements for the 2023 2024 school year fees will be going out via email **soon**, if you do not receive it then check your junk mail or let the office know. Upon receipt, fees can be paid online by debit or credit card through our <u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u> at <u>https://powerschool.psd.ca/public</u> or by cash or cheque payable to Parkland School Division (PSD). If for some reason you are unable to pay the fees right away arrangements may be made by calling Andy Fuñe at 780-963-3535.



Book Fair: Due to a conflict in scheduling we are postponing our book fair till December. We will let you know dates when they are finalized! **Library News**: It is crucial to clear any outstanding library accounts from last year, this will ensure that every student has the opportunity to sign out new resources. I kindly ask for your assistance in checking for any overdue materials that may still be at home and return them to the library as soon as possible.

Fair Notice - Violent Threat Risk Assessment: The goal of Violence/Threat Risk Assessment (VTRA) process is that every incident of youth violence in our communities be addressed. VTRA is early intervention – which is quite possibly prevention. The process is initiated and managed by school administrators who have received VTRA training from the Center for Trauma Informed Practices. Attendance Matters!!



In PSD, we help support families who need help getting their child(ren) to school. We know ther are many factors that affect attendance:

- Parents' work schedule
- Transportation
- Family events
- Appointments

Often families don't realize how much school their child is missing and the impact that has on everyone. They are more behind than you think.

1 DAV MISSED = 2 DAVS BEHIND



19 or more days

Missing just **TWO** days every month can add up to **19** days in a school year. This is the equivalent of missing an ENTIRE MONTH of instructional days.

10 to 18 days

Students who are absent an average of 15 days per year miss 1 YEAR'S WORTH of school by their graduating year.

9 or fewer absences

Students with good attendance generally achieve higher grades and enjoy school more.

Bus evacuation Practice Drill

October 18, 2023 will be our first bus evacuation practice!

School bus operators review evacuation procedures with their riders every year to ensure that everyone knows what to do in the event of an emergency. In typical school years, this involves holding a full evacuation drill once every fall and spring where students physically rehearse all steps involved, exiting the bus in an orderly fashion via the emergency exit(s).

When Exactly? Races begin at 4:15 pm, starting with the youngest runners. Please arrive by 4:00 pm. Parents of students in grades K4

are required to accompany their child to their running location and they must stay and supervise their child in that location. This year, the cross-country coaches are Mr. Shaw and Mrs. Rich. Please find one of them as soon as you arrive at the race location. Your coaches will make sure you are signed in and have the correct name and race category label. Parents, you are welcome to leave after your child's race, or feel free to stay and cheer on the other Muir Lakers.

All registered Muir Lake Cross Country athletes need to attend all practices.

Who? Any child from Grade K9.

Parents are responsible for all transportation.

What? Runners compete against children of the same gender and year of birth (e.g. girls, 2010). The races are through trails or an established route through a schoolyard. It is considered to be an accomplishment just to finish the race; some medals and ribbons are given out to the fastest runners. Born 2016-2018 runners run 800 m, born 2012-2015 runners run 1000 m Born 2011 and older runners run 2000 m.

Cost? \$5.00 for each race registered. Fees cover costs of medals, ribbons etc.

Foundation – Playground News

We have exciting news!!!!

Our large playground has provided endless hours of fun and enjoyment for our school and community with many pieces now in need of replacement. Muir Lake School Foundation is working hard on a plan to build a new fantastic and inclusive playground! An early stage look at our replacement can be viewed below, please recognize that we are just getting started and exact equipment pieces will likely change prior to construction.

We have started the process and are planning to be under construction by summer 2024 intending to be open by back to school September 2024!

Our initial steps have been completed and we are underway!

This project is slated to require over \$250,000 to be secured in a combination of government grant funding, Muir Lake School Foundation fundraising, and community donations. We have recently submitted documents requesting federal grant funding and should be hearing back early this fall about our first application.

We are grateful for Parkland County's initial contribution to help us kick off our project. Thank you to Councillor Phyllis Kobasiuk for advocating for our much needed project - we appreciate yours and Mayor Gamble's funding presentation at our recent board meeting.

We are excited to get this project going and will be reaching out to keep you updated and to ask for help in the coming months.
