General Information

Parking at School Safely: If you are driving your child to school, then we respectfully ask that you drop them off in either the **Muir Lake Hall** parking lot **or** use the drop off lane and let them out at the **NORTH** and **SOUTH** end of the parking lot so that they can use the crosswalk which is monitored by the staff. For the safety of everyone, we remind everyone that there is to be absolutely **NO PARKING on the side of the highway**. The parking can sometimes get VERY busy, so we appreciate your patience as our top priority is to keep all of our students and staff safe.

Visitors to the school are also reminded to respect the blue disabled parking spots that are in both the school and the MLCL Hall parking lots.

Visiting the School: Last year we had new security doors installed in the front entrance. This allows us to leave our front door unlocked. If you are at the school for any reason, please check in at the office.

Morning Supervision: Staff will begin supervision at 7:45am so we respectfully request that you do not drop your children off until after this time. Students will remain outside until the bell rings at 8:00am, then at this time they will make their way to the classroom through their designated doors. If they arrive ANY time after 8:10am they are required to go to the office through the front door to obtain a late slip.

Attendance Calls: If your child(ren) is not in attendance, please be sure to either call (780) 963-3535 and press 1 to access the attendance mailbox OR email the office at <u>MuirLake@psd.ca</u>, stating when and why your child will be away. If the office does not know why students are away then the fan-out message will automatically go out as they will be marked as absent with an unknown reason.

School Fees: Statements for the 2023 2024 school year fees will be going out via email **soon**, if you do not receive it then check your junk mail or let the office know. Upon receipt, fees can be paid online by debit or credit card through our <u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u> at <u>https://powerschool.psd.ca/public</u> or by cash or cheque payable to Parkland School Division (PSD). If for some reason you are unable to pay the fees right away arrangements may be made by calling Andy Fuñe at 780-963-3535.

Guidelines for Halloween Costumes:


- Costumes must still follow the rules of the dress code implemented in our school.


School Council Meeting

CARRY-ON ITEMS

Carry-on items are permitted on school buses; however, space is at a premium and safety is top priority. The **maximum allowable dimensions for approved carry-on items is 33 x 33 x 59 centimetres** (13x13x23 inches) and items must be able to fit on the lap of the student. All loose items must be in a sealed bag/case. Items blocking aisles or emergency exits on a school bus are in violation of Alberta Transportation regulations and are not permitted.





Larger items that cannot be adequately secured and stored are considered to be hazardous, as they could seriously harm someone in the event of sudden acceleration or a collision.

According to Alberta Transportation and the National Safety Code Standard 10, large unsecured items are not permitted and must be transported in a separate vehicle.



Carry-on items that are allowed on the bus

- Skates (skate guards on, inside a sealed bag which meets the above allowable dimensions)
- Small musical instrument (meets allowable dimensions—flute, clarinet, alto sax, trumpet)
- · A certified and registered guide animal

Carry-on items that are not allowed on the bus



- Hockey or ringette sticks, golf clubs, snowboards, toboggans, scooters, longboard skateboards, or any other large item that may interfere with the safety and comfort of any student on the school bus
- · Large musical instrument (tuba, tenor saxophone, guitar, drums, French horn or trombone)
- · Any kind of animals other than a certified and registered guide animal

Foundation Playground News

We have exciting news!!!!

Our large playground has provided endless hours of fun and enjoyment for our school and community with many pieces now in need of replacement. Muir Lake School Foundation is working hard on a plan to build a new fantastic and inclusive playground! An early stage look at our replacement can be viewed below; please recognize that we are just getting started and exact equipment pieces will likely change prior to construction.

We have started the process and are planning to be under construction by summer 2024 intending to be open by back to school September 2024!

Our initial steps have been completed and we are underway!

This project is slated to require over \$250,000 to be secured in a combination of government grant funding, Muir Lake School Foundation fundraising, and community donations. We have recently submitted documents requesting federal grant funding and should be hearing back early this fall about our first application.

We are grateful for Parkland County's initial contribution to help us kick off our project. Thank you to Councillor Phyllis Kobasiuk for advocating for our much needed project - we appreciate yours and Mayor Gamble's funding presentation at our recent board meeting.

We are excited to get this project going and will be reaching out to keep you updated and to ask for help in the coming months. As our first request, we are looking for personal and corporate sponsors so please email us if you or a company you know may be interested in discussing this opportunity.
