

REGISTRATION

Online Registration/Verification for 2025-2026

The annual online registration/verification process **begins February 10, 2025**, and must be completed for all students (Pre–K to Grade–12). The registration/verification process is conducted exclusively online.

Registration is for **new PSD** students or returning Evergreen & private school students requiring busing.

Verification is for returning PSD students.

During the registration process, **you must select the 2025–2026** school year to register for the upcoming school year.

To ensure that their child receives a bus pass prior to the start of the next school year, parents are required to **complete registration by 4:30pm on Friday**, **March 28, 2025**. This deadline will facilitate the routing of buses, bus pass production and data verification before the summer break while schools are still operating.

Bullying is unwanted and aggressive behavior that is typically repeated overtime. According to a survey the majority of Canadian youth aged 12 to 17 (71%) reported experiencing at least one form of bullying in the past twelve months (CHSCY, 2019). To effectively prevent and respond to bullying requires that we understand the difference between peer conflict and the more serious problem of bullying.

In today's world we often label any type of aggression or disagreement as bullying. However, it is important to remind ourselves that all bullying is mean, but not all mean behavior is bullying. Bullying is different from conflict. Conflict is disagreement between two or more people who have different beliefs, goals, and desires. On the other hand, bullying is when someone aggressively uses their "power" to target another individual with repeated, unwanted words or actions. Those targeted are hurt either physically or emotionally and have a hard time stopping what is happening to them. While conflict is a natural and inevitable part of life, bullying is never okay! As parents and caregivers, it is natural to worry about bullying as we all want our children to feel happy and safe. The good news is you are not alone! In Muir Lake School we take bullying seriously and our staff members are here to work with children and families to help keep children safe at school. As a parent or caregiver, you have a significant role to play in guiding and supporting your child through their school years and there are many positive steps you can take to help keep your child safe from bullying and harm and supporting them to resolve conflict in a healthy way. There are a few resources we are sharing with you please feel free to explore these resources. And remember we are in this together!!

Parking at School Safely: If you are driving your child to school, then we respectfully ask that you drop them off in either the Muir Lake Hall parking lot or use the drop off lane and let them out at the NORTH and SOUTH end of the parking lot so that they can use the crosswalk which is monitored by the staff. For the safety of everyone, we remind everyone that there is to be absolutely NO PARKING on the side of the highway. Please do not use the staff parking lot for drop off, the parking lot can get VERY busy, so we appreciate your patience as our top priority is to keep all of our students and staff safe.

Visiting the School: If you are at the school for any reason, please check in at the office. Morning Supervision: Staff will begin supervision at 7:45am so we respectfully request that you do not drop your children off until after this time. Students will remain outside until the bell rings at 7:55 am, then at this time they will make their way to the classroom through their designated doors. If they arrive ANY time after 8:00 am they are required to go to the office through the front door to obtain a late slip.

Attendance Calls: If your child(ren) is not in attendance, please be sure to either call (780) 963-3535 and press 1 to access the attendance mailbox OR email the office at MuirLake@psd.ca, stating when and why your child will be away. If the office does not know why students are away then the fan-out message will automatically go out as they will be marked as absent with an unknown reason.

School Fees: Statements for the 2024–2025 school year fees will be going out via email soon, if you do not receive it then check your junk mail or let the office know. Upon receipt, fees can be paid online by debit or credit card through our PowerSchool Parent Portal at https://powerschool.psd.ca/public or by cash or cheque payable to Parkland School Division (PSD). If for some reason you are unable to pay the fees right away arrangements may be made by calling Andy Fuñe at 780– 963–3535.

Fair Notice – Violent Threat Risk Assessment: The goal of Violence/Threat Risk Assessment (VTRA) process is that every incident of youth violence in our communities be addressed. VTRA is early intervention – which is quite possibly prevention.
